Laws and Regulations on Japan's AEO

The structures of Japan's laws and regulations on Japan's AEO are roughly illustrated in the chart below. Please find the respective Laws/Regulations attached for your ready reference.

(Structure of Laws and Regulations)

Act (Customs Act)

- Stipulate the rights and obligations of citizens.

<u>Examples</u>: benefits, requirements for authorization (reasons for disqualification), expiry and revocation of approvals

Cabinet Order (Order for Enforcement of the Customs Act)

- Stipulate specific procedures.

<u>Examples</u>: procedures for customs clearance with benefits, application procedures for authorization

Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance (Ordinance for Enforcement of the Customs Act)

- Stipulate details for the implementation of the specific procedures.

Example: Particulars to be set forth in the compliance program.
