Based on the EPA between Japan and Malaysia, the tariff is scheduled to be eliminated for roughly 97% of the value of commerce between the two countries (approx. 99% of export from Japan and approx. 94% of import from Thailand) within 10 years from enforcement of the Agreement.

## 1. Japan's key concessions

- Mangoes, Mangosteens, Forestry products other than Plywood, etc.: Immediate tariff elimination
- Fresh bananas: Tariff quota
  - ➤ Quota tax rate: (tax free 1,000 tons/year [renegotiation on the volume of quota in the fourth year after the agreement comes into force] )
  - > Tariff rate outside quota: 10%(April-September), 20% (October-March)
- Margarine : Tariff reduction from 29.8% to 25.0% in five years, and renegotiation in the fifth year

## (b) Iron and steel

- Tariffs on essentially all iron and steel products will be eliminated within 10 years.
- Malaysia provides import duty exemption for products from Japan which are directly used in the manufacturing activities subject to agreed conditions.
