II. SIGNIFICANT INTERDICTIONS IN 2014

1. Stimulants

Stimulants discovered hidden inside stone

In January 2014, Moji Customs inspected marine cargo containers shipped from Mexico to Yokohama Port, discovered and seized approximately 145 kg of stimulants concealed inside stone.





Stimulants discovered hidden inside cans of pineapple

In March 2014, Tokyo Customs inspected air cargo arriving from Mexico, discovered and seized approximately 30kg of stimulants concealed inside cans of pineapple.





Stimulants smuggled by Russian sailors

In December 2014, Hakodate Customs discovered and seized <u>approximately 27kg of stimulants</u> smuggled by some crew of a Russian trade vessel arriving at Otaru Port.





Stimulants discovered hidden inside second-hand car

In October 2014, Yokohama Customs inspected marine cargo arriving from the US, discovered and seized <u>approximately 17kg of stimulants</u> concealed at the foot of the driver's seat and the passenger seat of a car.





Stimulants discovered hidden inside rucksacks

In July 2014, Tokyo Customs inspected the belongings of a Japanese man arriving from China, discovered and seized approximately 15kg of stimulants concealed inside rucksacks.





2. Cannabis

Cannabis discovered hidden inside a toy box

In February 2014, Tokyo Customs inspected the belongings of a Japanese man arriving from the US at Narita Airport, discovered and seized <u>approximately 15kg of cannabis</u> concealed inside a toy box.





Cannabis resin discovered hidden inside a thing like sutra

In February 2014, Tokyo Customs inspected air cargo arriving from India, discovered and seized approximately 6kg of stimulants concealed inside a thing like sutra.





3. Narcotic

Narcotics discovered hidden inside an EMS (Express Mail Service) package

In June 2014, Nagoya Customs inspected an Express Mail Service (EMS) package arriving from China, discovered and seized <u>approximately 500g of the drug commonly known as "XLR-11".</u>





Narcotics discovered hidden inside an airmail package

In August 2014, Yokohama Customs inspected an package via airmail arrived from the Netherlands, discovered and seized approximately 100g of the drug commonly known as "Metilon".
